Los Angeles, CA – January 7, 2015 — Dr. Stan Stahl, president of the Los Angeles Chapter of the Information Systems Security Association (ISSA-LA), presented a check for \$3,000 to the ISSA Education Foundation (ISSAEF) in support of its scholarship program. The contribution will offer scholarships to support graduate level studies by individuals pursuing the field of Information Security. The Foundation also provides undergraduate scholarships, and in the future will offer grants to professionals wishing to expand their knowledge and skills in the information security field.

The purpose of the Foundation is to promote and support scholarships in information security; foster, support, develop and provide education and training for professionals in the field of information security technology; and conduct and promote seminars and education programs to educate the public in and about information security.

ISSAEF awarded its 2014 scholarships to Bryan Smith of Western Governors University, who received the graduate E. Eugene Schultz, Jr. PhD Memorial Scholarship, and to Thomas Jessop of the University of Colorado in Colorado Springs, who received an ISSAEF undergraduate scholarship.

To be eligible for an ISSAEF scholarship a student must be pursuing a career in computer science, which includes information security or privacy and must be an active, full-time undergraduate or graduate student in an information security related program. The applicant must fulfill the eligibility requirements as established by the ISSA Educational Foundation (ISSAEF) Scholarship Committee.
